The meeting was held at the Susquehanna River Basin Commission Conference Center at 4423 North Front Street, Harrisburg, Pennsylvania and Commission Chair Suzanne Dorsey called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

1. Opening Remarks

Commission Chair Suzanne Dorsey formally opened the meeting by outlining the rules of conduct for the meeting. She noted that a public hearing was previously held on January 30, 2025, and the written comment period was open until February 10, 2025. The Commissioners introduced themselves.

2. Executive Director's Report

Mr. Andrew Gavin, Deputy Executive Director, reported on the following:

- The Commission is currently reviewing proposals under our CU Mitigation Grant Program which closed the end of January, with awards to be announced in April. This is the fourth year the Commission has been able to awards these grant funds, and we plan to do the same next year given the success of the program. The current proposals represent over \$25 million in requested funds from over 60 applications. All look to provide benefits to our local watersheds, and include water conservation, groundwater recharge and other projects that will increase resiliency of our water resources during drought conditions and improve flows to the Chesapeake Bay.
- We are also close to announcing another round of awards under Maryland's Pay-for-Success program, established to help Maryland meet a portion of its Chesapeake Bay clean water goals. We're proud to be part of this innovative effort to assist Maryland in rewarding demonstrated nutrient reduction practices through competitive pricing. For this second round of awards, we're currently reviewing proposals that have the potential to deliver nitrogen load reductions that will meet Maryland's pollutant reduction goals for the Conowingo Watershed Implementation Plan, which is a critical component of the overall Chesapeake Bay clean-up plan.
- Lastly, we are keeping a very close eye on hydrologic conditions. As we will discuss in a
 minute, we ended 2024 dry and things haven't improved as much as we would like. We
 are continuing to monitor conditions and coordinate with state and federal agencies, and
 if needed, we will consider steps such as reaching out to project sponsors with drought
 mitigation measures, broadcasting water saving practices, and continuing to promote
 conservation.

3. Hydrologic Conditions Report

Manager of Planning and Operations John Balay provided an update on hydrologic conditions in the Susquehanna River Basin during the last quarter.

4. Minutes of March 13, 2025 Commission Meeting

On a motion by Commissioner Guise, seconded by Commissioner Whitcomb the minutes of the regular business meeting of March 13, 2025, were approved as written by a vote of 4-0.

5. General Permit GP-04 Into-Basin Diversion of Water (Resolution 2025-01)

General Counsel and Secretary to the Commission Jason Oyler presented General Permit GP-04 (*Resolution 2025-01*) which will provide a streamlined regulatory pathway for municipalities on or near the basin divide needing to bring drinking water supplies to the basin.

On a motion made by Commissioner Guise, seconded by Commissioner Whitcomb, the Commission approved Resolution 2025-01 as presented by a vote of 4-0.

6. Updated Dry Cooling Resolution (Resolution 2025-02)

General Counsel and Secretary to the Commission Jason Oyler presented a proposed update to the Dry Cooling Resolution adopted in 2015. The updated *Resolution* encourages the use of dry-cooling or hybrid dry-cooling technologies for other large scale water users, such as data centers and cryptocurrency mining operations.

Commission Chair Dorsey requested to table Resolution 2025-02 until the June regular business meeting. On a motion made by Commission Chair Dorsey, seconded by Commissioner Townley, the Commission agreed to table Resolution 2025-02 until the June regular business meeting by a vote of 4-0.
