## 2.1 Project Facility Description

Dover Township maintains and operates a public water supply system that delivers drinking water to a population of approximately 21,000 people in Dover Township, York County through residential, commercial, and industrial connections. The Dover Township Water System consists of eight (8) groundwater wells (Wells 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9, and 10) located in Dover Township, five storage tanks, two booster stations and a purchased water source. The Dover Township Water System also previously operated Well #7 which has been formally abandoned and grouted. The average daily water usage was reported to be 1.072 million gallons per day (MGD) in 2022, with a maximum daily usage of 1.502 MGD. The entire Dover Township water distribution area is serviced by the Dover Township Sewer Authority. The Authority maintains a Wastewater Treatment Facility that discharges to the Little Conewago Creek.

Well #11 was drilled and tested in order to provide a replacement water supply source to the Dover Township water system. Well #7 had exhibited chronic water quality issues and been out of service since 2015, but was previously permitted with a maximum consecutive 30-day average withdrawal of 0.099 MGD. In order to maintain capacity, the Township developed a replacement well in near proximity to Well #7. In 2020, two of the three locations, site A and site C, were drilled as test wells; site A was later formally abandoned and grouted. Test Well C was converted to a production well, referred herein as Well #11. The groundwater withdrawal application for Well #11 requests a 30-day average rate of up to 0.144 million gallons per day and a maximum instantaneous withdrawal rate of 100 gallons per minute. Site operations and water withdrawal are anticipated to begin in 2025 – 2026.
