The Kline Township Municipal Authority (Authority) owns and operates five groundwater sources (Wells 1, 2, 5, 6, and 8) and two surface water sources (Honey Brook Reservoir and No. 8 Reservoir) as sources for a public water supply. In 1999, the Authority purchased the system from the Honey Brook Water Company, formed in 1891. The Authority serves approximately 6,700 people, according to the PADEP Safe Drinking Water Reporting site. The Authority is requesting 1.2 million gallons per day (mgd) from Well 6, consistent with the previous approval (Commission Docket No. 20010603).
